



State Safety Data Quality Measure Changes

What's Changing?

The State Safety Data Quality (SSDQ) measures are changing in late 2023. FMCSA is adjusting the rating thresholds for several SSDQ measures and updating the standard by which it determines crash and inspection records to be reported on-time for the timeliness measures. Timely, accurate, and complete data is critical to the efficiency and effectiveness of FMCSA's enforcement programs.

How is FMCSA Supporting States?

The FMCSA Data Quality Program aims to support States in identifying and resolving data issues. States will have ample time to prepare for the changes. **The changes will be available in a preview area on the [FMCSA Data Quality website](#) for at least 12 months.** This area will only be available to logged-in FMCSA & State Portal users.

During this time, your State can make adjustments to improve your ratings, if the ratings shifted downward due to the changes. After the preview period is over, the SSDQ ratings will be available to the public.

Why are the Changes Happening?

The U.S. Department of Transportation's goal of zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries involving commercial motor vehicles (CMV) is an ambitious goal and requires a collective effort. FMCSA relies on its State Partners to augment our actions and increase our safety impact. One important way States do this is by collecting and providing high quality CMV crash and inspection data to FMCSA. These changes build on FMCSA's efforts to continually improve crash and inspection data in its systems. **Better data leads to safer roads.**
