Level Up to Expanded PRISM

To Level Up to Expanded PRISM, in addition to the requirements for Full and Enhanced PRISM, the State’s commercial motor vehicle (CMV) registration agency (non-IRP) must apply the six requirements for Full Participation to motor carriers operating CMVs in interstate commerce that have a gross vehicle weight (GVW) between 10,001 lbs–26,000 lbs.



1. Legislative or administrative authority to deny/suspend for carriers under Federal OOS



2. Collect/validate USDOT and TIN number of MCRS



3. Check OOS status before registration (Deny)



4. Check OOS status daily during registration (Suspend)



5. Upload vehicle registration information to SAFER



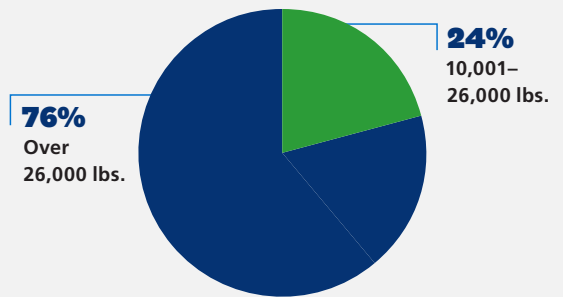
6. Report quarterly number of denials and suspensions

WHY LEVEL-UP TO EXPANDED PRISM?

- FMCSA and their State Partners must adapt with the ever changing motor carrier industry.
- The number of lower-weighted commercial vehicles on the road has significantly increased in 2021.
- 24% of CMVs are not addressed or captured by Full or Enhanced Participation in PRISM.
- Expanded PRISM can close this gap by incorporating and implementing lower-weighted vehicles in a State’s PRISM process.
- States that Level-Up to Expanded PRISM can identify and immobilize non-IRP interstate lower weighted vehicles, thus expanding their safety impact.

HOW TO GET TO EXPANDED PRISM

Each State’s registration program is different, and therefore the Expanded PRISM process will always vary and be unique. Generally, States looking to achieve Expanded PRISM will formulate a plan for the following. The PRISM Team must confirm that the State meets the requirements for the Full and Enhanced participation levels before they are eligible for Expanded PRISM.

Non-IRP Vehicle Data Collection

The State’s registration system must have the ability to collect and upload data for interstate non-IRP vehicles with a GVW between 10,001 lbs–26,000 lbs

- Additional coordination with State agencies may be required if this system is located in a different office/division within your State.
- Some States’ non-IRP offices may also have the ability to collect and upload additional vehicles (e.g., intrastate vehicles). While this is not a requirement for Expanded PRISM, it is considered a process enhancement.
